BRAVE WITH BEAUTY

This advanced picture book lends itself perfectly to a program for 6-10 year children. Together, we explore the life of Queen Gohar Shad and touch on topics of art, beauty, poetry, courage, history and geography—all in a way that children can understand and enjoy.

THERE'S A BABIRUSA IN MY BATHTUB!

Have your kids ever bathed with a babirusa, tangled with a tanglung or met a matamata? No? Then they're going to love this program! Every year, scientists discover new animals and together, we'll discover them too. We'll learn about animals that most people have never ever heard of -animals that not only look really strange, but have really strange habits.

This is an interactive, high-energy program, designed to ignite the curiosity of children (and parents!) about the extraordinary diversity of life on earth. Through funny poems, song, incredible facts and visual aids, we'll look at some unsung, unusual animals that are nothing short of amazing.

The program's activities include elements of language arts, vocabulary development and natural history. Oh we're going to have fun!

Poor Gus! He's a cowboy that believes everything. Here are three rollicking tall tales telling how Gus was cured of gullibility forever. In this lively program we'll have fun reading one of the stories and exploring its language arts elements such as synonyms, hyperbole, simile, metaphor, idioms and the very sound of words. Kids will have a ball making up their own words and their own creative idioms.

Also, we'll learn about the tall tale genre, its history and characteristics and we'll touch on some other famous American tall tale heroes such as Paul Bunyan, John Henry and Steamboat Annie.

THE MARVELOUS MAZE

A romantic fairy tale set in a beautiful garden that tell how a clever princess outwits a spoiled, lonely prince and helps him find love.

The Marvelous Maze, becomes a springboard for exploring a wealth of topics including the Renaissance, the history of mazes, the definitions of strength, riddles, vocabulary and similes. This program could also include interactive activities such as maze-making and riddle making!

MARIELLE IN PARIS

Marielle in Paris is a comic adventure story of a brave mouse heroine and it's also a loving homage to the beautiful city of Paris. In my interactive, program, I enhance storytelling with activities that spark artistic creativity and imagination including a fun guessing game. We'll also talk about how everyone has fears, how shy doesn't mean timid and how being afraid of something doesn't mean you're not brave.

This program's activities touch on psychology, geography, vocabulary development and encourage a child's imagination, artistic creativity and observation.

PIGS DANCING JIGS

Storytelling and game time for the little ones. *Pigs Dancing Jigs* is a rhyming alphabet book showing animals around the world doing busy, zany things. My program is geared to children from pre-school through 1st grade and encompasses storytelling, rhyme games, animal knowledge and song. With high-energy and engagement, we have more fun than a barrel of monkeys!

LECTURE: TO GIVE VOICE

EXPLORING LESSER-KNOWN PERIODS AND PLACES IN JEWISH HISTORY

I've twice won the Sydney Taylor Award given by the Association of Jewish Libraries for "The Most Outstanding Book in the Field of Jewish Literature for Children." I've also been twice nominated for the National Jewish Book Award and won the Sugarman Family Award and the Louis B. Dessaur Grant for excellence in Jewish Writing for Young People. In this lecture I tell how I came to the writing about lesser-known periods and places in Jewish history. I touch on the importance of recording oral history and of rescuing from obscurity the "nooks and crannies" of Jewish life that have been hidden for centuries.

Writing as Ritual is packed with nuggets of advice, writing tips and techniques for enhancing your spiritual and emotional connection to your work. Learn how the rituals of sacrifice, communion, reflection, pilgrimage, candle lighting, recitation and hallowing serve as acts for a writer to strengthen commitment, increase efficiency and foster both personal and artistic growth. This talk is as much about the writer's worth as it is about the writer's words. It is designed to encourage and empower writers to take charge of, and value their writing aspirations.

- Use fiction techniques in your writing

- Craft sensory details and dialogue
- Leverage your unique talents and knowledge
- Create an "angle" to market your work
- Hook your reader right off the bat

READING AND INTERACTIVE DISCUSSION: PLACES IN TIME

REFLECTIONS ON A JOURNEY

Once, I traveled the world for a year and a half, meeting people from Austria to Afghanistan. Years later I wrote about the adventures I experienced and the extraordinary people I met. Through the lens of time and with middle-aged wisdom, I came to understand how my youthful adventures lent meaning and perspective to my life. Now in its third printing, Places in Time, was named Best Travel Book of the Year by the Northern California Travel Writers Association and won the Gold Award from the Society of American Travel Writers. This program includes the dramatic reading of a story followed by Q &A and some tips on getting started as a travel writer.

WORKSHOP: THE ART OF TRAVEL WRITING

For those who dream of being a professional travel writer or just want to sell the occasional article from their vacation, this is the workshop! I discuss the craft of the travel writer including the art of selection and description, use of creative non-fiction techniques, hooking the reader, and finding the right "traveler voice." Also covered is the business of travel writing: how to find the right market for your work, as well as information about press trips and travel organizations. An inspiring combination of hands-on exercises, discussion and personal guidance. This can be a half or full-day workshop.

WORKSHOP: WRITE A BOOK KIDS WANT TO READ

All children's books need to tell a story but how do you know if you have a good story? I can move you closer to getting published by examining the elements of your story idea or manuscript: plot, structure, character and dialogue.

Whether you're interested in writing a picture book, chapter book for beginning readers, a middle grade book, or a young adult novel, you'll learn these easy tips and techniques to take your writing to the next level. You will learn:

- The main elements your story must have
- To visualize scenes before writing them
- To bring forth your own unique and authentic voice
- The best way to plot your story

- Techniques to make your character believable
- When to use narrative and when to use dialogue
- The goals your revision must accomplish

This workshop is appropriate for beginning and intermediate writers. It's a combination of lecture, discussion, readings, in-depth critiques and hands-on exercises. The focus is deeply personal: on your specific work and your writing goal.
